### Global Information Access

### Copyright 101

Much of the scholarship available from the University Libraries is purchased through subscriptions, and access is limited to Virginia Tech affiliates. Copyright law regulates how this and other information can be shared with others -- including images, films, and other media that you might want to use in class. It's particularly important to consider copyright when recording lessons and sharing them widely, as your liability increases.

If you're interested in sharing VT-exclusive and other copyrighted content for educational purposes, start by completing a quick <u>fair use assessment</u> so that you can decide, in good faith, how much of the content you can legally use.

# **Digital Collaboration Tools**

Goal setting guide for team projects

- Planning guide for students, created by the Libraries' Fusion Studio coordinator

<u>Hypothes.is</u> - annotate web texts together, share notes and comments

Mural - visual collaboration tool; basically a virtual whiteboard

Google Apps - share files with Drive, message with Chat, create Forms and Sites, etc.

<u>Padlet</u> - bulletin-board style posts, files, etc. to organize and share notes and media

<u>Dropbox</u> - file-sharing and storage (an alternative to Google Drive)

<u>CATME</u> - create groups with Team-Maker tool and facilitate confidential student evaluations of team dynamics using research-based Peer Evaluation tool

Wheel of Names - randomize your selection of student names for questions, teams, etc.

Kaizena - feedback tool that makes it easy to leave voice comments in response to assignments

<u>Trello</u> - project management and tracking for teams

#### Media Creation Tools

Canva - easily create, or have students create, graphics/handouts/social media posts

<u>Visme</u> - create ebooks, infographics, etc.; up to 5 projects free

MakeAGif or Giphy GIF Maker - create custom gifs from existing video or images

Screencastify or Screencast-O-Matic - record a quick screen capture and use basic editing tools

Animoto - drag-and-drop video creation

Wordpress - make free websites and blogs

Blogger - another free blog creation tool

<u>Timeline JS</u> - quickly create interactive timelines using simple Google spreadsheets

### Alternatives to Zoom and Google Meet

<u>Discord</u> - recommended for text chats & for smaller group calls with screen sharing; voice chat feature allows breaking into small groups

Microsoft Teams - hold chats and meetings, organize groups, share files

Slack - chat service that facilitates multiple channels; integrated file sharing and apps

WhatsApp - messaging and calling service

VoiceThread - web-based tool to share and comment on files
